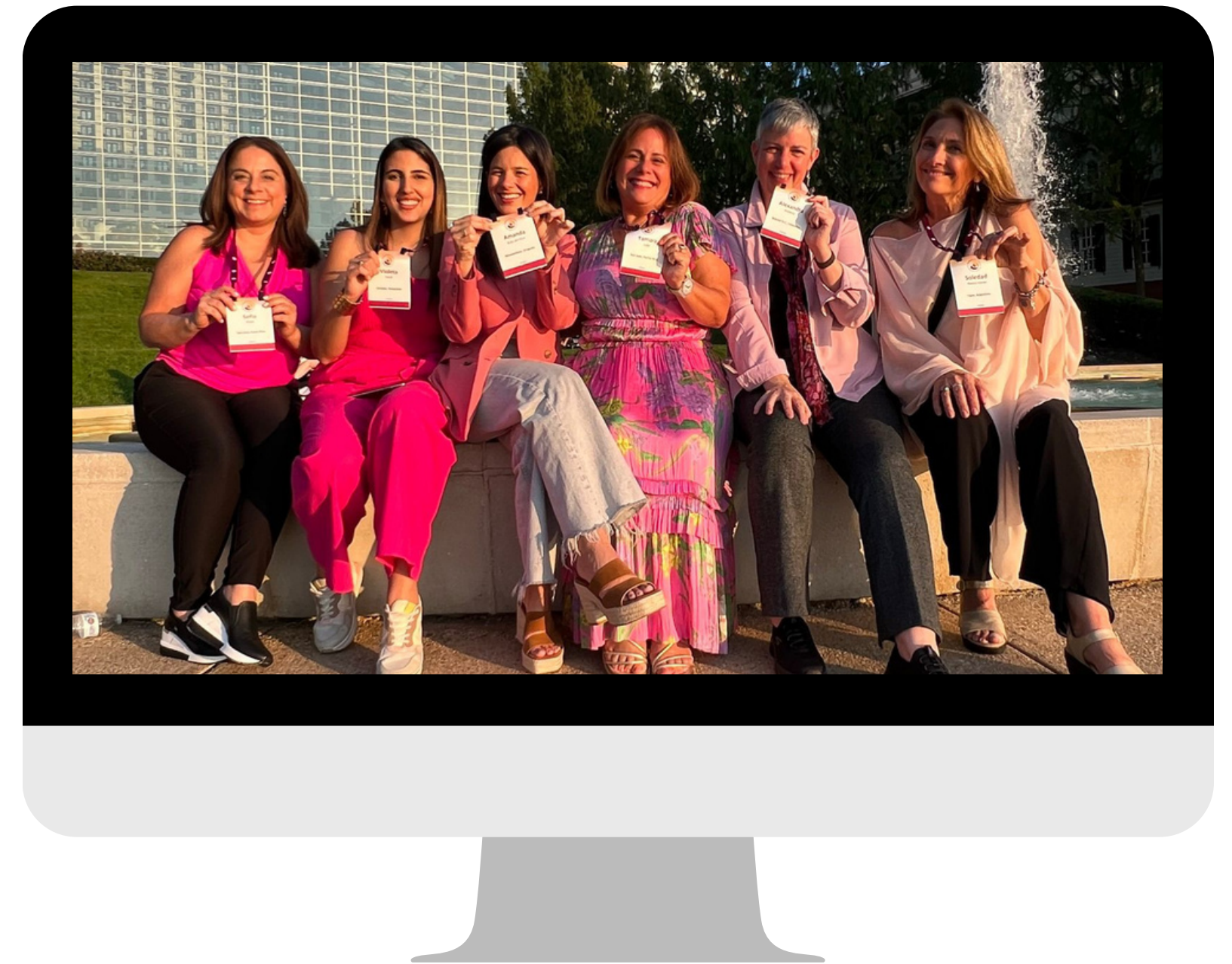


Program Overview

Second goal

Create a WGWBD registry of the Americas with a special zoom in each country.

Receive support to execute their projects in each country with impact.

Fourth goal

Giving visibility to their actions in order to raise awareness among their communities on these issues.

Fifth goal

To generate engagement to execute an specific project with a clear analysis and strong ideas to execute in each participant country.

Each participant has to
present a project to
implement.
Each one of them will have a
one year mentoring process.

- Patient or immediate family member /Women with a bleeding disorder.
- Advanced english language skills.
- Approved and current VISA.
- Proactive and interested in obtaining new knowledge.
- With basic knowledge of hemophilia and bleeding disorders.

All our grants will:

- Present letters of recommendation and get an interview to present themselves.
- Participate in previous meetings to plan their participation in BDC.
- Have group meetings during the BDC, to get the first ideas of their projects.
- Have follow ups with COA'S TOGETHER program's coordinators.
- Delivered their projects related with women.
- Get the chance to have a mentor of HOG, NBDF or COA throughout 2024.

She plans to continue being involved in the organization.

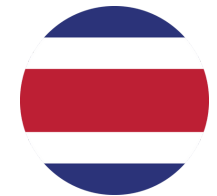
